# i-Ready Pathways Reading & Math

Rio Calaveras school is using *i-Ready Reading and Math* for skills improvement. While there are times set aside in class for students to practice i-Ready, it's also **assigned for home practice**. The pathways offer personalized learning paths that target skills through practice, exercises, instructional videos, and quizzes to fill students' learning gaps.

- Students are assigned 60 minutes per week in each subject. 40 minutes in class, 20 minutes at home.
- 2 passed lessons in Math, 3 in Reading per week.
- Absences: 20 minutes per day in each subject. Thank you for your support.

Studies have shown that involvement in the arts is associated with gains in math, reading, cognitive ability, critical thinking, and verbal skills. Art learning can also improve motivation, concentration, confidence, and teamwork. Finally, drawing, painting, and creating arts can be a relaxing, non-pressure activity that refreshes the mind.

We studied the elements of art. We did line drawing, used tempera paint, oil pastels and watercolor. We also folded origami, rolled marbles, made lanterns, cut papel picado, snow, and even painted on wood.
