

ART: 1-Point Perspective

Our Class learned how to draw using perspectives. We started with 1-point perspective, which is a drawing method that shows how



things appear to get smaller as they get further away and converging at a point called "vanishing point" on the horizon line. In April, we will draw using 2-point perspectives. It's going to be fun!

Our class will begin the State Report research assignment on April 22. The State Report consists of 3 parts: Research and Writing, creating a Webpage to display state information, and finally, the students will produce a Video Commercial to advertise their states. The report will account for part of the writing grade, speaking and listening grade, and a major Social Studies grade for the 3rd Trimester.

This is an exciting and beneficial assignment where students will use multiple skills to complete the report. The research state report is due on May 17.



"Escape from ML's Library" Challenge

"Escape from Mr. Lemoncello's Library" is our 2nd Trimester literature study book. After finish reading the story, we were divided into five teams and went through a Kahoot challenge, a Jeopardy game, and a final group challenge to be the first team to "escape from the cafeteria" by solving riddles and puzzles.

3 rounds and more than 300 points later, **Team Sierra** (Jonathan, Bella, Faith, Kalysta, Jazmine, Sivohn) narrowly defeated the other teams to win the grand prize, which consisted of class money and a brand-new Mr. Lemoncello book, which is the next book in the series, and also the coveted Golden Pineapple Award.

March STEM Projects




We spent March's STEM periods working with 3-D Augmented Reality and Ozobots. We colored pictures and used the iPad's camera to create 3D images of birds, butterflies, fireworks, dinosaurs,

rockets, and interacted with them. We even unlocked alien games and driving tracks.

Ozobots are mini robots that can follow different combinations of color lines to make it turn, spin, or push down bowling pins. We also used the iPads to program Ozobots to do cool tricks. We created codes and sent the codes to the Ozobots to make them zig-zag, skate, sprint, and blink different color lights. It was really fun.

Physical Fitness Testing (PFT)

Our class has started to practice for The Physical Fitness Test (PFT) coming in April. The PFT is required for all 5th graders and consists of push-ups, curl-ups, trunk lift, shoulder stretches, and a mile run.
